It operates in the most remote and inaccessible areas of Central Odisha, where the area is tribally dominated and about 80% of the households living below the poverty line. Its development initiatives cover more than 5.2 million under-

privileged persons, including women, children, small farmers, rural artisans, the elderly, the disabled, and the destitute.

It has developed an integrated strategy by combining direct service delivery with development support activities like research, advocacy and networking. In remote areas with rural and tribal communities, it initiates sustainable socio-economic development programmes, sets-up structures to ensure safe drinking water, provides sexual & reproductive health education as well

NYSASDRI School of Journalism and Social Work

The COVID-19 pandemic has created the largest disruption of education systems in history, affecting almost all learners in countries and all continents. Closures of colleges and other learning spaces have impacted severely in low and lower-middle income countries. Similar is the situation in the NYSASDRI School of Journalism and Social Work, which is exacerbating the careers of the students. Though the situation couldn't be controlled by Govt.

completely, yet all the authority, lecturers and all student are having in good coordination, with which the online classes are going in a proper manner and the students are comparatively satisfied and happy with the online facilities and the academic cooperation as well. In between the decision of Supreme court of India has relieved the students to an extent. As per the decision, the 4th Sem exam will be held whereas 2ndsem students will be promoted

as per their marks secured in the 1st sem. While learning at home through online classes, the students are still continuing sensitizing the community in their areas on cleanliness, keeping social distance; regularly usage of mask etc and they are trying to avoid the stereotype thinking and fear ness from the mind of the people.

Odisha Forest Sector Development Programme – II – Sadar

Farm forestry was one of the leading actions taken under the project in the Dhenkanal FMU. The objective of project farm forestry activity is to encourage VSS for tree plantation and tree base farming systems on their land. This was implemented in 18 number of VSSs covering 118 hectares area, 51,000 seedlings and 198 beneficiaries were involved directly. Simultaneously with degraded forest restoration under JFM approach with cooperation with department, we were selected land and beneficiaries to meet the target. Apart from that under the convergence work, 70 vegetable seed kits in two VSS were distributed through which 4 Nos of SHGs and 70 households are benefited in this convergence work.

At the other hand in the Hindol FMU, the team

has given importance on the community mobilization, institutional management training, orientation to animators on OFSDP-II and their role and responsibilities, PRA and preparation of micro plan. Also, the leaders of the VSS were oriented about the process of mobilizing the community and ensure their participation in every activity. The training was organised in all 27 VSSs of Hindol FMU to enhance the capacity of the leaders to bring the people into the common platform. Under the micro planning, formation of VSS building was one of the outcomes, so to create a permanent infrastructure and to make the VSS more functional in effective manner, a VSS plan was experimented in the Babandha Badasahi. The support of the project is also praiseworthy to give a right

shape in their process of involvement to accomplish the plan. Of course, the project got the support of 4.10 lakhs from the forest department but the differential part of the expenditure is born by the people as their contribution. During the process of the construction, every persons of the village have taken sole interest to contribute their time and energy. The community is so excited about this infrastructure that now they can utilize the new building not only for VSS office and conference, but also a place of all activities like the functioning of Angawadi Centre, Village meeting, Cultural programs and other meeting related to the Govt programs.

NYSASDRI is involved the GNDP programme views from front line (VFL) 2019 with national coordinating organisation (OSVSWA) with an objective to strengthening the inclusion and collaboration between at risk people in civil society and Government in the design and implementation of policies and practices to reduce risks and strengthen resilience. In this context after survey findings and conclusion local action plan were prepared through workshop from 05 community in Jagatsinghpur and Koraput district of Odisha.

Self-help to Persons with differently abled



Persons with disabilities generally have more health-care needs than others – both standard needs and needs linked to impairments – and are therefore more vulnerable to the impact of low quality or inaccessible health-care services than others. Compared to persons without disabilities, persons with disabilities are more likely to have poor health. While having a disability probably doesn't by itself put someone at higher risk from Coronavirus,

many persons with disabilities do have specific underlying conditions that make the disease more dangerous for them. So NYSASDRI has made an urgent call for immediate response, addressing the specific needs of persons with disabilities to maintain their health, safety, dignity, and independence in the community throughout the COVID-19 outbreak and related health emergencies. Hence two meetings were conducted abiding

the COVID-19 norms prescribed by Govt for meeting during the pandemic to raise awareness among these disable person about Corona epidemic. We aware them about the Corona virus and safety measures like use of mask, maintain social distance, regularly wash hands with hand wash, use of sanitizers, and not to go outside home without any cause etc.

Observed the International Youth Day



here shared his innovation on positive health care approaches based on nature of health. He has explained about the demand of life along with the biologically given potential and the personally acquired potential. During this webinar he has given importance on five major components such as Demands of life, biologically given potential, per-

sonally acquired potential, social determinants of health and environmental determinants of health. He has also shared a bright example on Mahatma Gandhi who is not a leader by born but due to his potential he became a good leader.

Taking Eye Care to another level

In a mission to take the ophthalmic services to another height, Kalinga Eye Hospital, Dhenkanal has appointed Dr. Kapil A Bhatia as a consultant ophthalmologist. Dr Bhatia has done his MBBS from Gujrat University and has more than 6 years of expertise experience in the field of Ophthalmic after completion of his DNB from L V Prasad Eye Institute, Bhubaneswar. In these six years not only, he has sharpened his expertise in cataract, retinal detachment surgery, squint surgery, anti-glaucoma surgery, entropion, ectropion, ptosis, various laser procedures and

other oculoplastic procedures but also has performed over 15,000 sight restoration surgeries. We firmly believe that after addition of Dr Bhatia into the team, retina services are already introduced and hope in the coming days Kalinga Eye Hospital will able to provide more comprehensive services in eye care sector.

The 35th National eye donation fortnight is observed from 25th of August to 8th of September every year. During this occasion, a meeting was organized by the PHC, Kathagada of Dhenkanal on Monday 31st August 2020, where the expertise

from Kalinga Eye Hospital has sensitized the participants (ASHA and other Health workers coming under the PHC) about the need of eye donation, who can donate eyes, steps to be taken after a death of a person so that their corneas can be retrieved. The myths on eye donation and celebrities who have pledged their eyes were also shared with the participants. The COVID norms were followed while sensitizing the participants.



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
